



Land tenure alternative conflict management

ILC believes that secure access and secure rights to land are fundamental to achieving food security and sustainable rural development, and has a long standing interest in addressing the causes and the management of land tenure conflicts. ILC is convinced that for working with land access and security of tenure, land tenure conflicts need to be resolved.

FAO, in collaboration with Livelihoods Support Project and the International Land Coalition, has published a Manual on Land Tenure Alternative Conflict Management. This aims to acquaint land tenure conflict practitioners with the main characteristics of a land tenure conflict, of the context in which the conflict takes place, of the stakeholders taking part in the conflict, and the balance in power relations. It intends to provide users with more resources to identify the processes and evolution of a conflict and the different options for its management and eventual resolution. *For additional information visit:*
