BACKGROUND

Bharatiya Jan Seva Ashram is a non political, non government, not for profit voluntary organization which is registered under Society Registration Act (21), 1860. For past 13 years the organization is actively engaged with the task of eradication of poverty as also ameliorating the living conditions of the socially excluded and the oppressed sections of the people of 15 villages belonging to Badlapur, Mahrajganj, Khudhan, Aspur Devsara and Magraura blocks of districts Jaunpur and Pratapgarh in Uttar Pradesh.

Bhartiya Jan Seva Ashram has been putting all-out efforts to bring about positive change in the life style of the poor and marginalized as well as neglected families of the rural areas of these two districts through promoting people's participation. The main endeavor of the organization is to address to the minimum necessities like food, clothing and shelter of the socially deprived and marginalized people and even to provide opportunities for better education and social security, enhancing human dignity, and mental and physical well being.

With a view to transforming the above thoughts into reality an awareness programme is in operation which involves the young men and women, old and the youth of the marginalized sections of the society on the basis of people participation; the programme aims at inculcating leadership, sense of dignity and self-depend in such a way that all the aspects of development i.e. social, economic, political, cultural and educational are taken care of.





OBJECTIVES OF THE ORGANIZATION

- ❖ Promotion of Peace, Social Harmony and National integrity.
- ❖ Creating enabling environment for the all round development of boys and girls.
- ❖ Promoting scientific and technological research and its dissemination and promoting use of organic fertilizers in agriculture.
- ❖ To serve the helpless and the marginalized people and to inculcate a sense of self dignity in them.
- ❖ To collaborate with the national level development programmes as also social development programmes.
- ❖ To manage all round development programmes for the weaker sections as well as persons living below poverty lines in the area of intervention.
- ❖ Creating enabling environment for mainstreaming the dalits, marginalized and poor families by making them aware, better educated and organized for leading life of human dignity.

VISION

Establishing autonomous and self-reliant society.

MISSION

Motivating for sensitizing, better awareness, organization selfdignity and self-reliance.

FIELD OF WORK

The organization is actively engaged in two districts of Uttar Pradesh, Jaunpur and Pratapgarh. In Jaunpur the area of intervention covers 3 blocks viz. (i) Maharajganj, (ii) Badalapur and (iii) Khudahan, while in Pratapgarh we cover (i) Aspur Devsara and Magraura, in all covering 168 villages. For creating awareness in these two districts, the entire district is covered by means of setting up organizations of dalits and marginalized people, motivating them to participate in community development activities and Panchayati Raj Institutions. The organization has been conducting meetings and camps and cultural shows for enhancing participation of men and women in development and social harmony programmes.

The following programmes were implemented by the organization in 2005-2006.

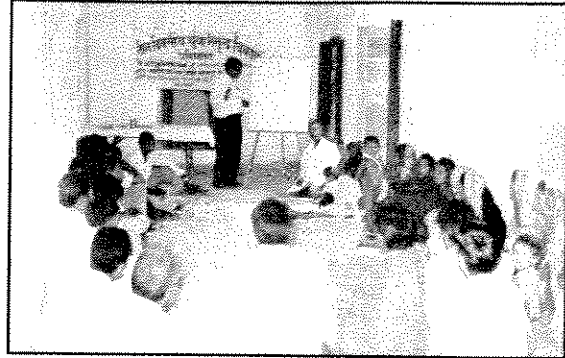




EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN & DALITS -

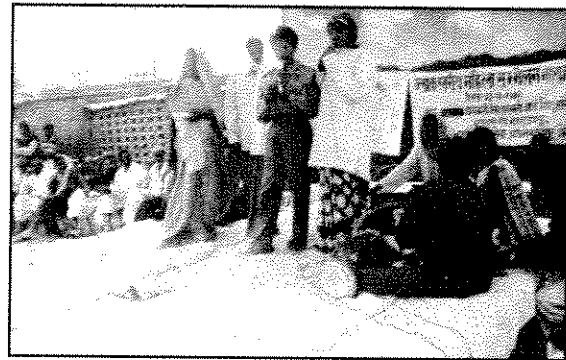
* Dalit Youth Leadership Development Programme-

With a view to building leadership and capacity of dalit youth so that they may apply their zest and energy towards their personal, social and national prosperity, two 3 day programmes were organized (i) 26th to 25th September 2005 at Badlapur (Jaunpur) and (ii) 28th to 30th December 2005 at Aspur Devsara (Pratapgarh) in which a total of 75 young men and women were trained.



* DALIT WOMEN AWARENESS CAMPAIGN & CONFERENCE -

In the entire month of December 2005 a creative programme with the help of a cultural team was organized in 21 villages of Aspur Devsara block of Pratapgrah district in which the main purpose was to spread awareness, organize dalit Women to raise their voice against oppression and exploitation and claim a hike in wages for their labour. On 25th December 2005 a one day Women's Conference was held at Garamafi Primary School Aspur Devsara (Pratapgarh) in which a total of 500 women participated. On 18th December 2005 at Badlapur (Jaunpur) a women's conference against violence against women was organized where also about 500 women took part to deliberate mainly on violence against women.



* **WOMEN'S DAY & SAVITRI BAI PHULE DEATH ANNIVERSARY-** On 10th March International Women's Day and Savitri Bai Phule's Death Anniversary was celebrated by

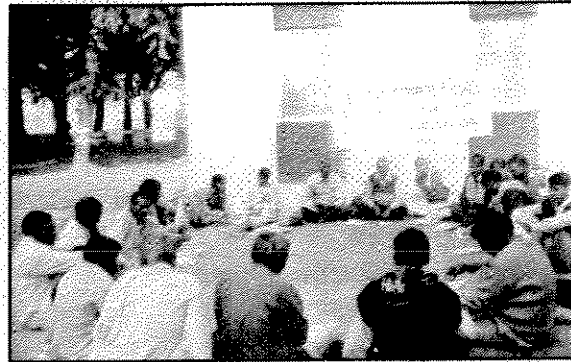




women's organizations established by Bharatiya Jan Seva Ashram and their staff, because Savitri Bai is the first woman who started educating women after educating herself first. Women took part with a view to emulating from her struggles.

*** TRAINING ON SELF HELP GROUPS -**

Women office bearers of 22 Self Help Groups belonging to 15 villages of Aspur Devsara block of district Pratapgarh were imparted training where main focus was on creating strong organizations through SHG formation, maintenance of records and better management of SHG and livelihoods generation. The programme was



conducted from 28th to 31st March 2006 in which 52 women took part.

*** PANCHAYAT EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMME -**

A workshop at Panchayat-level was organized from 20th to 31st January 2006 for Panchayat representatives and Gram Sabha members of 15 different Panchayats. In all 640 women and men Panchayat representatives participated. The focus was on the problems and hindrances in regard to the PRIs.

*** PANCHAYAT VOTERS AWARENESS CAMPAIGN -**

With a view to enable community to field right candidates both men and women and elect them in a free and fair manner a long campaign for spreading awareness amongst rural voters was organized. In the campaign covering 15 gram panchayats of Aspur Devsra (Pratapgarh) and Badlapur (Jaunpur) support of cultural programmes, wall-writing, distribution of pamphlets and poster display were the main techniques for spreading the message.

 **CHILD LABOUR ERADICATION :**

*** EDUCATIONAL APPROACH -**

Bharatiya Jan Seva Ashram has launched a educational programme for





creating conducive environment for making villages free from the incidence of child labour. The details of the programme are as under :

*** MANAGEMENT OF CHILD-LABOUR FREE VILLAGE SCHOOL -**

The organization is running a primary school for child labour especially girls at Bhaluahi and Kasturipur villages of Badlapur Block (District Jaunpur) and also a primary school at Lamhan, Gondalpur villages of Maharajganj Block. At Gondalpur a girl's school is also being run. There are 50 children and 2 teachers at each of these schools as students. All the students are also engaged with some gainful domestic or other sundry jobs.

*** MANAGEMENT OF ASHA BAL VIDYALAYA BUDHANPUR -**

The organization has been running at Budhanpur village of Badlapur Block a primary school which has 64 children. This is the first ever school in this village.

*** DISTRICT LEVEL CHILD LABOUR ERADICATION PROGRAMME -**

For creating an environment conducive to eradication of child labour a district level workshop was organized on 12th July 2005 at the headquarters premises of the organization in front of Yamaha Agency. Media persons and voluntary organizations were prominent participants alongside the large number of community members. The focus of deliberations was on linking child labour/drop out students with the mainstream of education.



*** CHILDREN'S FAIR & CONFERENCE-**

On 28th July 2005 a children's fair and conference for children of all schools was organized at Bhaluahi at the organization's school. A number of cultural and sports competition programmes including street plays were held. Winners were given suitable prizes.

*** CHILD LABOUR ERADICATION CAMPAIGN MEETING & CULTURAL PROGRAMME -**

In 50 villages of Badlapur and Maharajganj Blocks child labour eradication





campaign was launched in which the main activities were, holding meeting, cultural programmes, rallies and wall writing.

* **CAPACITY BUILDING OF THE STAFF & TEACHER'S TRAINING -**

Training programmes in several phases were conducted at Badlapur Dak Bungalow for capacity building of the colleagues of the organization as well as for school teachers of all schools.

 **HEALTH AWARENESS PROGRAMME -**

The organization has been constantly engaged with spreading health awareness and accessing health facilities amongst dalits and other deprived people. The details of the programmes carried out in this connection are as under :

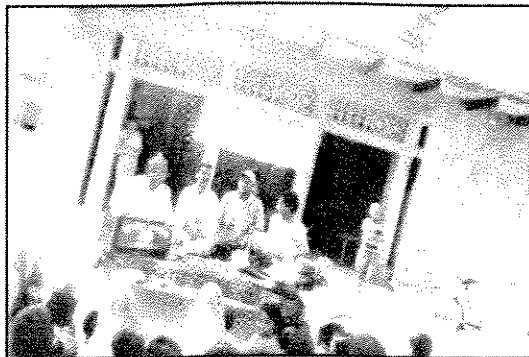
* **HEALTH AWARENESS & HEALTH-CHECK CAMPS -**

The organization organized Health Awareness Camps in 8 villages of Badlapur Block (i.e. Muradpur, Dugoli Kalan, Karanpur, Ghanshyampur, Shahpur, Rampur, Chandapur and Rupchandrapur). The various facilities provided at these camps included – health related information on diet, sanitation, personal hygiene, especially gynecological diseases, paediatric diseases, problems related to pregnant women's care under the expert guidance of the government hospital's medical doctor. Usual necessary vaccinations were done. Thus more than one thousand women, men and children of the whole village were benefited.



* **PULSE POLIO & NEEM CAMPAIGN -**

Adequate support to the National Pulse Polio Programme was provided in twenty villages of Badlapur Block. In 20 villages children were administered neem leaves potion in several phases in a





bid to getting them rid of intestinal worms, skin diseases as also common fever .

* **SANITATION CAMPAIGN -**

Sanitation Campaign was launched amongst Dalit communities of 20 villages falling in Devsara Block. The work related to good practices about cleaning utensils by use of ash, taking care of children's hygiene, potable water and food-storage was effectively discharged by the women of these 20 villages.

* **MANAGEMENT OF ADOLESCENT GIRLS CENTRE**

Adolescent Girls Centers are being run in 20 villages of Badlapur Block (District Jaunpur). On an average there are 20 girls associated with each of these centers. Here they come to know about health aspects about their critical age. Those girls who are uneducated are taught basic minimum reading writing and got mainstreamed on education front.

 **LAND AND LABOUR RIGHTS PROGRAMME -**

Since its inception the organization is active on the issue of land rights and labour rights. During the year efforts made are as follows.

* **RESEARCH ACTION PROGRAMME**

In collaboration with Uttar Pradesh Land Development Corporation, Labour Rights Campaign and National Institute of Rural Development, Hyderabad an action research programme based on lease & control of land and labour issues is chalked out. This is being conducted in 10 villages of Badlapur and Maharajganj Blocks of District Jaunpur, where initial survey was done during the year. Preliminary round of discussions with the District Magistrate Tahsildar and other officers have been carried out.

* **CONFERENCES, WORKSHOPS & MEETINGS**

Several conferences, workshops and meetings on the issues related with land and labour rights were organized at Badlapur, Mahrajganj and Khutahan.

* **WORKSHOP ON NATIONAL RURAL EMPLOYMENT GUARANTEE ACT 2005**

A workshop on the implementation of National Rural Employment Guarantee Act was held to acquaint the local voluntary organizations, other offices was organized at Badlapur, head office of the organization.

 **SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE LITERACY PROGRAMME -**

* **TRAINING OF MASTER TRAINERS AT REGIONAL LEVEL**

In collaboration with Gorakhpur Environmental Action group 3 batches each





having 30 members were imparted training at Jaunpur and Bhadohi on different aspects of sustainable agriculture.

* ONE DAY TRAINING ON SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE

One day training programmes on sustainable Agriculture Literacy were organized in Jaunpur, Ghazipur, bhadohi, Azamgarh, Allahabad and sultanpur districts with view to motivating farmers for refraining from chemical pesticides and fertilizers and taking to organic farming.

GARIMA CAMPAIGN –

The organization intervened in the existing practice of carrying night soil on human heads. The scavengers and their stakeholders were briefed on the health hazards and their civic responsibilities so that the lost dignity of these helpless people is restored to them. It is heartening to mention that by utilizing government's support in this regard, the organization has ensured alternative occupations to the scavengers engaged in disposal of night soil.

In Azamgarh district also nine persons have been provided alternative employment on contract basis. The organization is constantly in touch with the persons being thus rehabilitated.
