LANDex GLOBAL LAND GOVERNANCE INDEX

that puts people at the centre of land data, democratising land monitoring and building a data ecosystem where all voices can be heard. Built in consultation with members and strategic partners of ILC, LANDex is based on common indicators and methodologies, giving a platform to the voices of the individuals and communities often absent in official numbers.

Organised around ILC's 10 Commitments, the Global Land Governance Index measures progress towards people-centred land governance on three levels: legal framework, implementation and impact. In addition, standardised LANDex indicators allow members to generate globally comparable data and contribute to monitoring of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Voluntary Guidelines for Tenure (VGGTs).

Early uptake and successes have been seen in Nepal, where government representatives committed to exploring the use of the tool for formal data collection.



Since 2012, the Land Matrix has captured 2,078 concluded deals, covering over 80 million hectares of land.

The **LAND MATRIX** was the first of its kind and remains the primary global reference point for data, information, and knowledge on large-scale land acquisitions. This includes agriculture, livestock production, timber extraction, carbon trading, renewal energy production and conservation.

It's doing so by capturing and sharing data about these deals on its online open access platform. It is a trusted source of information for researchers, journalists and civil society and has been used for monitoring by investors, governments, and donor agencies.

LANDMARK is an online interactive platform that focuses specifically on land collectively held and used by indigenous peoples and local communities. LandMark utilises a number of data layers intended to capture the land rights of indigenous peoples and local communities, as well as detail the pressures on their land, changes in the land over time, and their contributions to environmental protection.

160 land and environmental defenders were killed in 2018

Yet, in 80 percent of cases where data was available, killings were preceded by an attack or a threat on the affiliated group or community. Today, there is a systematic lack of regular, accessible and disaggregated data documenting the threats and attacks perpetrated against these defenders. Collecting data beyond killings is important in order to analyze patterns of violence, identify at-risk areas and provide support to targeted individuals, groups and organizations. ...coming to you in December 2020
